

- ➤ The Hazard Police Department conducted Active Shooter
  Training at Hazard Vo-Tech, Center of the Mountains
  University, Starland Daycare, Cabinet for Health and
  Family Services and the Perry County Library
- ➤ The Hazard Police Department conducted an Active Shooter drill at Hazard Vo-Tech school
- ➤ The Hazard Police Department responded to, investigated, and made an arrest in the triple homicide at Hazard Community College.
